Gama-dji provides valuable preparation for learning at RMIT. Strong connections established during the program provide an enduring base for the students, and can contribute to long-term positive student learning experiences, increased retention and successful academic outcomes.

Program details

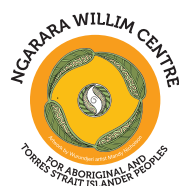
The program is open to all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students over several days prior to the first semester of the commencing year. It provides students with an opportunity to transition into further education feeling more prepared, confident and aware of the support available.

Scholarships

By participating in Gama-dji, students are invited to apply for a range of scholarships that aim to make the commencing year more affordable. Scholarships include the Gama-dji Laptop Grant, Gama-dji Text Book Grant and the Gama-dji Grant, that individually provide support that can cover the cost of a laptop, the first year of prescribed textbooks and a three-month gym membership to promote an active and balanced lifestyle.
